#### Directions to MMS Headquarters

##### FROM BOSTON

Travel west on the Massachusetts Turnpike/I-90 to Exit 15. Keep right beyond the tollbooth and follow the signs for I-95/128 North. Follow 95/128 North for approximately two miles to Exit 27A-27B (Wyman Street/Winter Street). Stay to the right on Wyman, and then turn right at the lights onto Winter Street. Remain in the right lane and cross over Route 128. Stay in the right lane and follow Winter Street. (See "All" below.)

##### FROM THE WEST

Travel east on the Massachusetts Turnpike/I-90 to Exit 14. Keep left beyond the tollbooth and follow the signs for I-95/128 North. Follow 95/128 North for approximately two miles to Exit 27A-27B (Wyman Street/Winter Street). Stay to the right on Wyman, and then turn right at the lights onto Winter Street. Remain in the right lane and cross over Route 128. Stay in the right lane and follow Winter Street. (See "All" below.)

##### FROM THE NORTH

Travel south on Route 128/I-95 to Exit 27B (Winter Street). When coming off the exit, stay in the far right lane and follow Winter Street. (See "All" below.)

##### FROM THE SOUTH

Travel north on Route 128/I-95 to Exit 27B (Wyman Street/Winter Street). Stay to the right on Wyman, and then turn right at the lights onto Winter Street. Remain in the right lane and cross over Route 128. Stay in the right lane and follow Winter Street. (See "All" below.)

##### ALL

Take a left at the Waltham Woods sign on Winter Street, and follow the road up the hill (approximately one-third of a mile). MMS Headquarters will be directly in front of you. (Note that parking and the main entrance are at the back of the building.)

# CONSIDERING FUNCTIONAL DISORDERS OF THE GI TRACT

## Program Description

The MGA Endoscopic Education Program Committee has been formed with the mission of providing practical, evidence-based lectures and seminars to practicing gastroenterologists and GI fellows in New England who may not have the opportunity to attend more distant and extended national conferences. This lecture series covers a broad range of topics in endoscopy, hepatology, and gastroenterology.

This fourth annual post-graduate course will provide an update on the multi-disciplinary nature of these diagnoses and the publication of new guidelines.
